Targeting the Heart: HEAR

HEAR Skills

Holy Spirit

Trust and Believe that the Holy Spirit is speaking to them, and that He has much better things to say than you do.

Engage the Whole Heart

Be completely attentive to them, and listen thoroughly to all four aspects of their heart (be listening to your whole heart too).

Ask Open and Powerful Questions

Ask open-ended and powerful questions that guide the person to hear from the Holy Spirit and to make choices from their deep desires.

What are you thinking?

What are you feeling?

What desires are touched in you?

What choices do you want to make?

Respond from Your Heart

After pursuing their heart first, share how this conversation has impacted your own whole heart (not your own story), and then rejoice in what the Holy Spirit has done.

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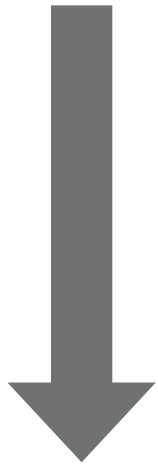

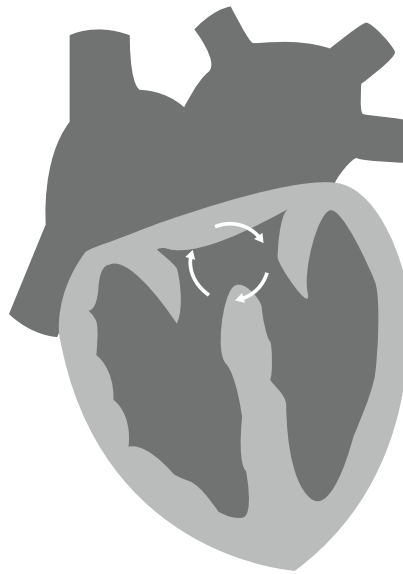


Four Aspects of the Heart

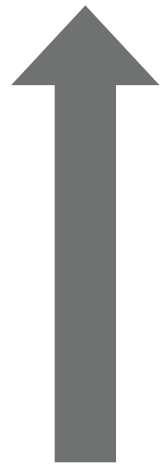

It is a fluid model. It is an art not a science. Your goal is to love the other person well, not to complete the steps of HEAR. At times, you may just need to be with the other person before asking any questions, particularly when you need to empathize or mourn with the other person. Here you ask questions only to clarify the situation and to know how to be present with the other person. Once you've been present with the other person, then you can move onto other questions. Defining action steps is dependent on how many steps in the model you can authentically move through. Don't press. Listen and follow your intuition.

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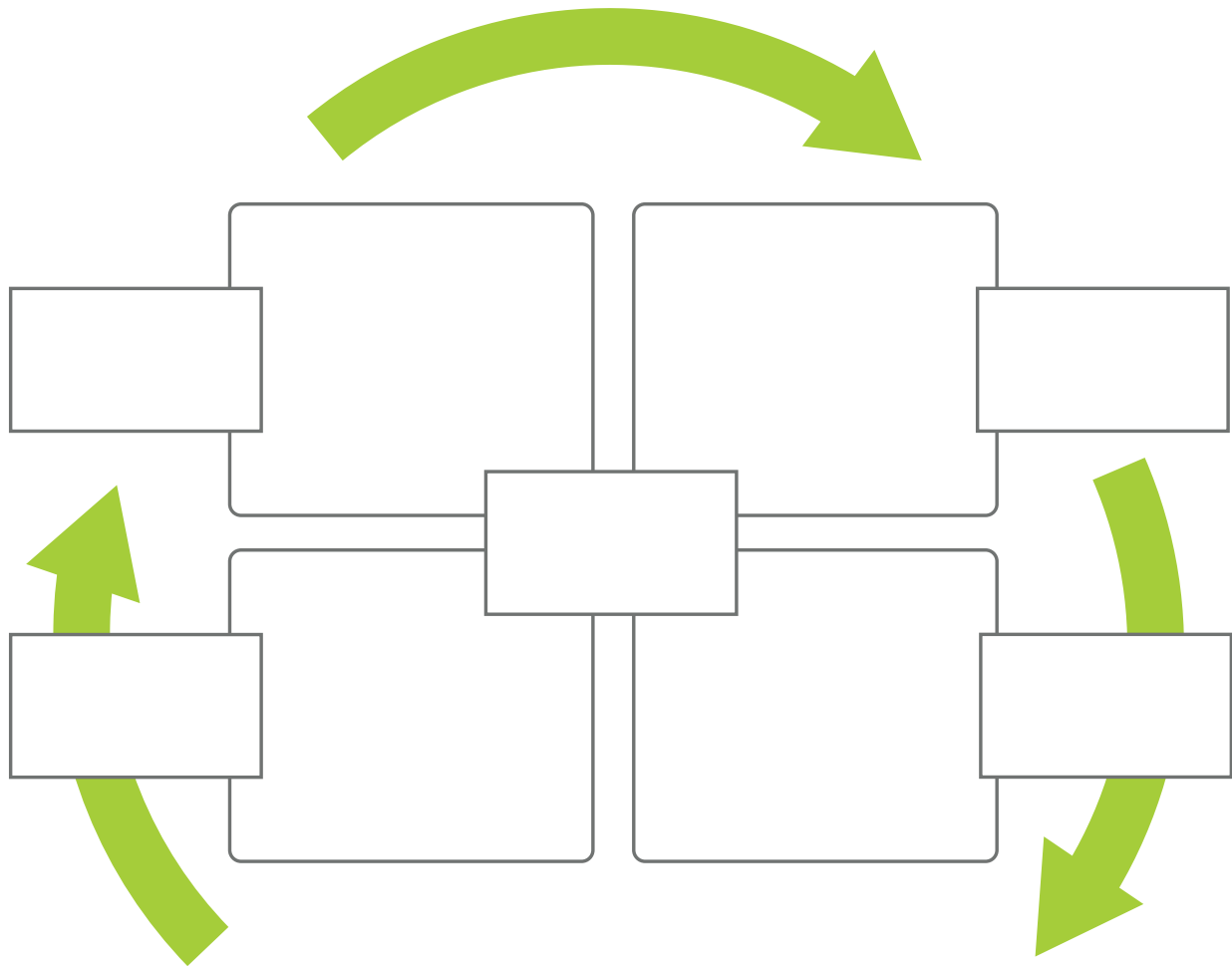

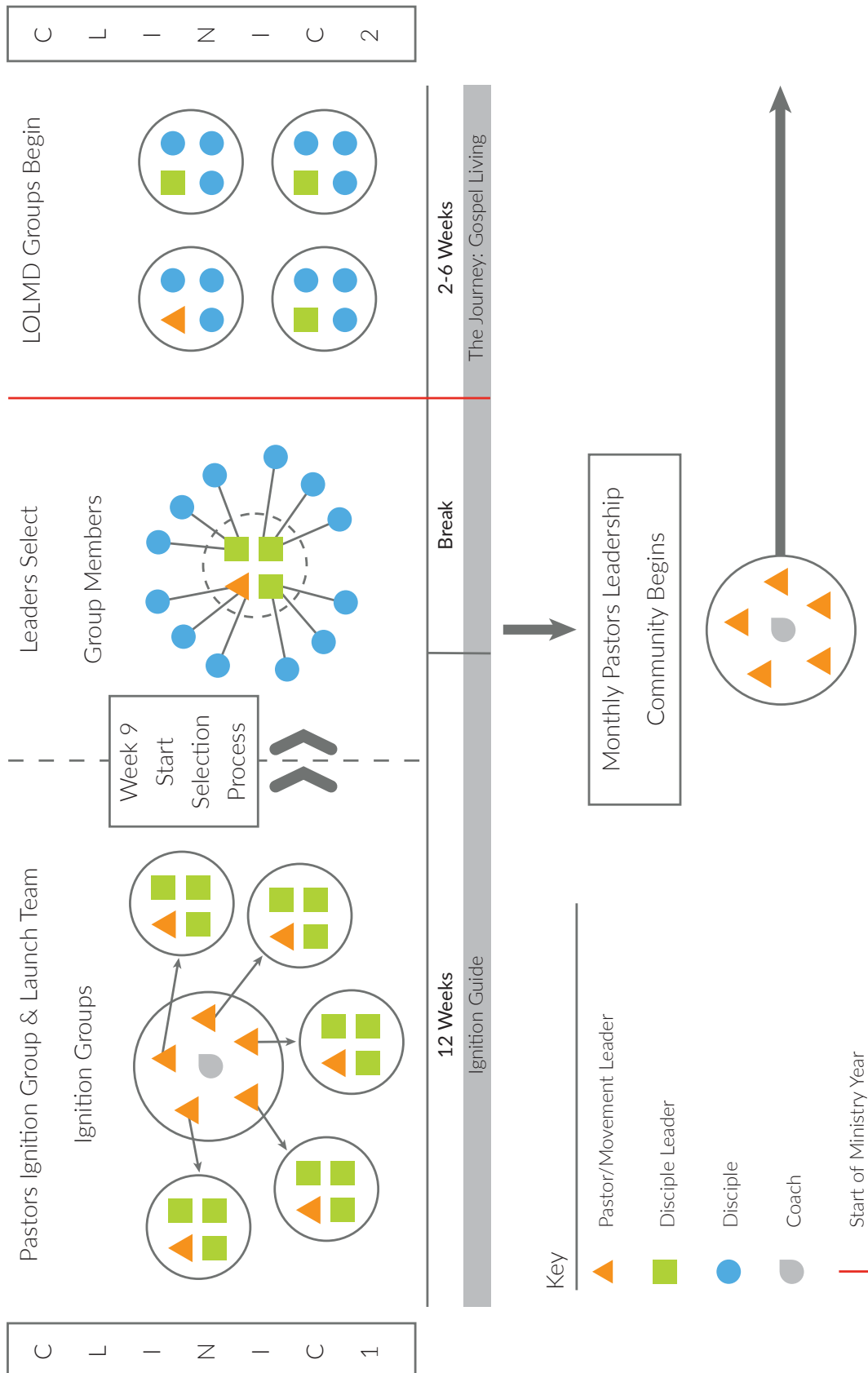

Appendix: Engaging the Heart



In order for Life on Life Missional Discipleship to be life changing, we must engage with others from our whole heart and engage them from their whole heart. The Gospel has the power to change anyone from the inside out. We see how Jesus engaged people from His whole heart to their whole heart.

God told us to “go and make disciples” and He promised “I will build my church.” We are making and training mature and equipped followers of Christ, God desires that his body, the Church, would live in the fullness of his larger love Story so He can reveal himself to the world.

The purpose of this handout is to be used with coaching so that leaders are inspired and equipped to live and lead deeply from their whole heart in Biblical community where they live, work and play.

THE KEY VALUES WHICH UNDER GIRD THE CONCEPT OF ENGAGING THE HEART ARE:

1. The Heart as the wellspring of life, encompasses our thoughts, choices, emotions and deep desires.
2. Transformation that flows from the heart results in fundamental, significant, sustained change.
3. Biblical Community experienced in authentic relationships reflects God's love, grace, and truth.
4. Beauty that reveals God naturally, artistically, and relationally.

THE KEY OBJECTIVES WHICH FLOW OUT OF THE PRACTICE OF ENGAGING THE HEART ARE:

1. Be more able to lead the members of your group into a deeper relationship with God and with one another (Love God and Neighbor)
2. Be more able to love the members of your family with more of your heart, soul, mind, and strength (Loving Neighbor as Yourself)
3. Develop and plan strategies for more deeply engaging the hearts of the members of your group (The Beloved Fellowship)
4. Be aware of and able to live from the Four Aspects Of the Heart
5. Be aware of and consistently use the HEAR Skills
6. Experience Biblical Community through authentic relationships that reflect the love, grace and truth of Christ as we draw one another out, rejoice with each other, mourn with each other, give courage to one another, and grow in loving one another deeply from the heart.
7. Be inspired and equipped to use the TEAMS elements of transformation.

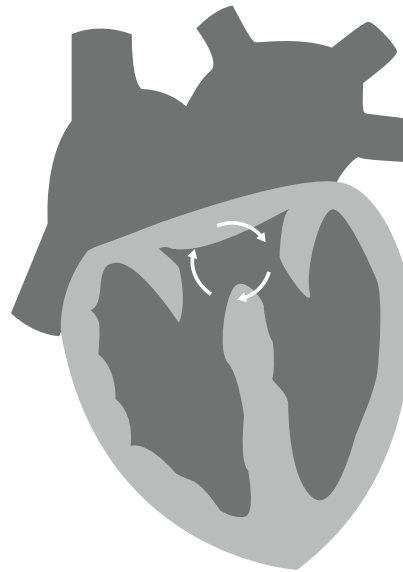


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Appendix: Engaging the Heart

The Four Aspects of the Heart and TEAMS

The elements of transformation that we see Jesus consistently using in His training of His disciples are truth, equipping, accountability, mission and supplication (aka TEAMS). A brief overview of the Gospels will reveal many examples of these discipleship elements being used by our Master. These TEAMS elements make up the “engineered” aspect of life on life missional discipleship as seen in the structure of a group and the format of the curriculum. When each aspect of the TEAMS elements are experienced from all four levels of the heart, something powerful happens. The HEAR skills of engaging the heart make up the “organic” aspect of life on life missional discipleship as we move away from the curriculum and focus on the relationships in the group.

Here is how a group time could look like when we are using both the TEAMS elements (engineered) and HEAR Skills (organic) together. A wise leader will not use the whole group time to focus on the entire curriculum. A portion of the time is used to discuss the lesson but there must also be space for life on life engagement to happen.

Truth — We discuss the main points of the truth in the lesson that we have all prepared. We are seeking to consider the truth with our whole heart (mind, emotions, desires and choices).

Equipping — We want to massage the truth into our lives so that it becomes understandable and usable. Again, the best equipping will happen when all four aspects of our heart are engaged.

Accountability — The best accountability questions will address the thought, emotional, deep desire and volitional aspects of our heart. We are not primarily seeking behavior modification but rather heart transformation that only comes through the gospel as we repent, believe and obey in the power of the Holy Spirit.

As we are in the equipping and accountability sections, the HEAR skills come into play as we pursue a person’s heart. There will not be time for everyone to be engaged, but over the course of weeks it is possible.

Mission — Most people will not engage in missional living just because they know they should do it rationally. We must help people tap into mission from their whole heart. As we address a person’s distorted desires, which ultimately prevent missional living, only then can we help people connect their heart to God’s missional heart.

Supplication — Prayer comes alive when we learn how to pray from our whole heart. As we pray Kingdom-focused, Scripture-soaked and Vision-filled prayers, God changes our heart to match His and our maturity and equipping grows deeper.
